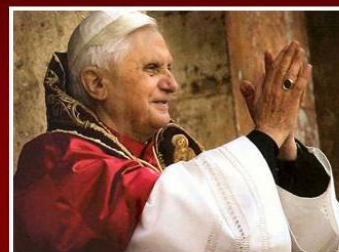

### **Pax Christi Corner –A Reflection by Chase Nordengren**

In the past 20 or 30 years, a strongly negative passion has stirred in this country towards immigrants, particularly those from Latin America. Terms like "illegal alien" and "anchor baby" have entered our discourse with little thought towards the hurt and the hatred those terms can show to our human brothers and sisters. Yet, in our Catholic spirituality, we find a strong reproach, a reason to question these attitudes. We share with our sisters and brothers in Latin America a common patron in the Virgin Mary, to whom a greater spirituality and devotion can become a source of unity. Additionally, the Biblical stories of Christ's flight into Egypt and the flight of the Israelites are reminders that we as the faithful are often alien to our land, always sojourners on the path to the Kingdom.

We hope you will join Pax Christi this Tuesday for the final part of the Msgr. John A Ryan discussion series, on modern issues in Catholic social teaching. We are joined by Helene Robertson, director of our office of International Student and Scholar Services. Ms Robertson has spent her career working on immigration issues, and has an experienced perspective on the challenges of the current immigration situation.
