- Consider the things your jobs require, and when and how each thing was to be done; and then surround your work with prayer.
- Without being discouraged because of our sins, we should pray for God's grace with perfect confidence, relying on the infinite merits of our Lord.
- Don't weary of doing little things for the love of God, who regards not the greatness of the work, but the love with which it is performed."
- Act with God in greatest simplicity, speaking frankly and plainly and imploring his assistance in our affairs just as they happen.
- In our conversation with God we should engage in praising, adoring and loving Him incessantly for His infinite goodness and perfection.

Brother Lawrence (c. 1614 - February 12, 1691) was a lay brother of the Discalced Carmelite Monastery in Paris.

As we enter study week, we should practice humility in our work, lifting our studies to God and trusting that he will send his spirit to inspire our efforts for his glory.
