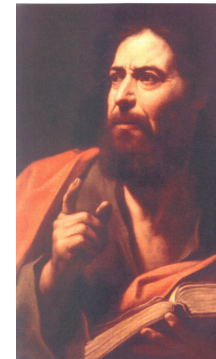

## YEAR OF ST. PAUL



**“Recognize we are all Paul. And like him, we are all on the road to Damascus.”** Fr. David O’Connell, CM

Many of us were present for the Mass of St. Paul on Thursday afternoon to open the academic year and to hear Fr. O’Connell’s inspiring homily urging us to respond to Christ’s call to conversion.

If you missed the Mass and Father O’Connell’s homily, we hope you will read it in its entirety on <http://home.cua.edu>. Father O’Connell quoted the Holy Father words **“Paul wants to speak to us –today,”** and urged us to constantly respond to Christ’s call in our own lives.

Like St. Paul, we are all called to conversion, just as he experienced on “the road to Damascus, the place where Paul first met Jesus Christ.”

**“Open your eyes and see the Lord work in your life: everyone has room to grow and more to offer. Pick yourself up and change....Conversion is not simply an intellectual or emotional thing. It is an act of will.”**

St. Paul’s “story is full of hope, that conversion is possible, no matter how established you may be or think you are, no matter what your title or position, no matter what your age or experience, no matter what your life has been like or the state of your soul, at this moment. **St. Paul speaks to us today.”**
